My wife took some photos of work being performed on Cedar Grove Elementary... I am quite shocked that there are large openings left in the side of approved occupancy rated buildings. Left in this unprotected condition, you create a severe risk of existing construction system exposed to both the weather and a possible intrusion of pests.

Your RFP documents for these projects specifically indicates in section 6.20 that the contractor shall supervise and direct the work using his best skill and attention.

He shall be solely responsible for all means, methods, techniques, sequences, and procedures for coordinating all portions of the work under this contract.

Leaving a fully operational building unprotected is clearly not using the best skill and attention. Protecting the existing building to ensure the sequence of construction is clearly their responsibility.

Section 6.29....The contractor shall be entirely responsible for proper care and protection of ALL work.

Section 6.30 During the progress of the Work, the contractor shall assume all risk and shall bear all loss occasioned through neglect or accident caused by his work or workmen, until such work has been completed and accepted.

Leaving an existing operational building open to the elements, specifically during a storm event, is not in anyway proper care or protection of all work, and specifically shall bear all risk and all loss.

Furthermore, your project specification manuals have several sections defining this issue.

013100-1 D. Administrative procedures – Coordinate scheduling and timing of required procedures.... Include but not limited to the following.... 3. Installation of temporary facilities and controls.

What is the administrative plan for the temporary facilities and controls to protect the existing building?

The health of our students and staff should be at the forefront of these projects.

On a personal level with a child attending this school, this raises a severe concern.... It is has rained for several hours today alone. And with the wind driven rain conditions, you are going to have water inside those classrooms.

From photos these openings have been open for several days.... Days that we had bad weather conditions.

Are you planning on having mold testing done to ensure the air quality in these classrooms is good? I know your new specification on the acoustical ceiling tiles calls for #1729 tile which has humiguard in it, but I'm not sure your old

ceiling tiles contain the same.

Based on the fact that these openings have existed for several days now, I'm assuming the contractor either doesn't have the manpower to protect them, doesn't feel its necessary or didn't include it in his budget and is pushing back....

At minimum you should employ your maintenance staff to grab a bucket truck, some form of plastic sheathing and get those openings wrapped up.....

Deal with the costs during arbitration later on...

I really want everyone to understand that I grew up in town, I graduated from east, I live here, plan on living here for a long time, and I am a supporter of whatever was asked of the board when it came to getting more for our kids.

I was a firm supporter of the referendum.... Because we are what we give back to our children.

But understand, right now.... My 16 year old is held to a higher standard of accountability and responsibility for his school work, and dedication to the football team than a general contractor with a 20+ million dollar contract.

We are going sit in class and tell these kids to double check your work, get your work done on time or you lose credit, don't do anything that can affect others in the classroom, and be accountable, yet we can't even make sure debris is cleaned up from our play areas, drop off zones, and we aren't even aware guys are working at the schools?

What kind of example are we setting?

Wow. Ginny thank you for this email. I am very sorry about your son. That's terrible. As you know, I keep trying to incorporate a document which outlines more specifically what the exceptions to the EO are. I drafted 6 versions of the attached document. I keep being told that we are doing all the things within the EO, including extreme leniency with regards to the loop holes. However, if we put them in writing we "tie our hands" and can be less flexible than if we leave it as written.

For example, I wanted to define "extreme heat" to mean any outside temperature above 70 degrees. I was told if next week the temperature is 68 degrees irregardless of humidity levels, which I'm told is a factor we consider with regards to extreme heat, then we'd take away our flexibility in allowing mask optional weeks/months. I'm told if rooms/buildings are air conditioned, we cannot offer the option of "mask optional".

I wanted to include language that prevents any staff to inquire about other staff members or students exemption status or vaccination status. I was told that is what's being told to all staff at all schools so not necessary to put it in writing. I was told, "If we have "four" teachers, for example, that are really harassing students about mask wearing or encouraging or discouraging vaccinations then they will be dealt with appropriately.

As a former Board Member you know exactly how far we can push the envelope. Please educate me and I'll push it as far as humanly possible. Otherwise, I keep getting shut down. Please call and tell me what I can do as a board member.... what is within my power. I keep being told I have no power. We have to follow the EOs, and when I suggest pushing back, am told we already are.

Thank you for your email. I'm sure you'll receive a call from Dr. Genco or one of our Assistant Superintendents as I've been told for every email they receive they call personally to help resolve the issue.

I am with you 1,000% on this issue. It makes zero sense. Kids can wrestle in the gym with no mask but have to sit at a desk, eat in lunch as you pointed out maskless but can't sit at their desks. A teacher could take them on a field trip to a movie theater and they wouldn't be required to wear masks there but they can't sit in a classroom. It is insane and makes zero sense. On that I can tell you we all agree.

In an effort to provide some level of comfort for families I have drafted a resolution to adopt or edits to our policy to incorporate. I currently have two children attending TR Schools.

I present myself in this letter as a very qualified construction professional. I hold general contractor licenses in several states including but not limited to CT, NJ, PA, NY State, all 5 boroughs of NYC, Florida, Georgia, Louisiana, Maine, Delaware, Maryland, Virginia and both Carolinas.

I just completed the new Tractor Supply Store, one autozone store (down route 37 west) and I just started construction of the new Autozone store in town on Fischer Blvd.

I am well versed in the codes and requirements of construction up to 8 story buildings in commercial settings, and I am recognized as a contractor that has successfully performed work designed by Maser Consulting (now Colliers).

My wife took some photos of work being performed on Cedar Grove Elementary... I am quite shocked that there are large openings left in the side of approved occupancy rated buildings. Left in this unprotected condition, you create a severe risk of existing construction system exposed to both the weather and a possible intrusion of pests.

Your RFP documents for these projects specifically indicates in section 6.20 that the contractor shall supervise and direct the work using his best skill and attention.

He shall be solely responsible for all means, methods, techniques, sequences, and procedures for coordinating all portions of the work under this contract.

Leaving a fully operational building unprotected is clearly not using the best skill and attention. Protecting the existing building to ensure the sequence of construction is clearly their responsibility.

Section 6.29....The contractor shall be entirely responsible for proper care and protection of ALL work.

Section 6.30 During the progress of the Work, the contractor shall assume all risk and shall bear all loss occasioned through neglect or accident caused by his work or workmen, until such work has been completed and accepted.

Leaving an existing operational building open to the elements, specifically during a storm event, is not in anyway proper care or protection of all work, and specifically shall bear all risk and all loss.

Furthermore, your project specification manuals have several sections defining this issue.

013100-1 D. Administrative procedures – Coordinate scheduling and timing of required procedures.... Include but not limited to the following.... 3. Installation of temporary facilities and controls.

What is the administrative plan for the temporary facilities and controls to protect the existing building?

013100-6, B. Preconstruction Conference. Agenda shall discuss the following....

“r. responsibility for temporary facilities and controls..

s. procedures for moisture and mold control.”

What’s in the meeting minutes of the precon agenda on the temp facilities and controls, and mold and moisture mitigation procedures?

Leaving wide open areas of an existing building clearly does not comply with either of these topics.

013100-8..... Addresses it again in pre-install conference requirements.

If you reference section 015001-1, the specification on temporary facilities and controls, it addresses

Moisture protection plans, for protection of materials from water absorption and damage.

Part 3.4 Security and Protection Facilities Installation

1. Protection of existing facilities....

K. Temporary Enclosures... Provide temp enclosures for protection of construction, in progress and completed from exposure, foul weather..... Provide temporary weather tight enclosure for building exterior.

Part 3.5 – Moisture and Mold.

As you can see you have several sections of your construction specifications that require some sense of protecting building features from these elements....Mold and Moisture paramount as they directly affect the health and well being of all occupants.

I request that someone urgently review this situation, protect the existing buildings from the weather elements, and employ your special testing agency to check all humidity and moisture levels due to the current state of the unprotected features.

The health of our students and staff should be at the forefront of these projects.

On a personal level with a child attending this school, this raises a severe concern.... It is has rained for several hours today alone. And with the wind driven rain conditions, you are going to have water inside those classrooms.

From photos these openings have been open for several days.... Days that we had bad weather conditions.

Are you planning on having mold testing done to ensure the air quality in these classrooms is good? I know your new specification on the acoustical ceiling tiles calls for #1729 tile which has humiguard in it, but I'm not sure your old

ceiling tiles contain the same.

Based on the fact that these openings have existed for several days now, I'm assuming the contractor either doesn't have the manpower to protect them, doesn't feel its necessary or didn't include it in his budget and is pushing back....

At minimum you should employ your maintenance staff to grab a bucket truck, some form of plastic sheathing and get those openings wrapped up.....

Deal with the costs during arbitration later on...

Toms River Board of Education Members,

I am an involved and educated parent. As I watched the August BOE meeting with parent after parent demanding that masks be optional, I estimated there were hundreds of parents in attendance. The governor had already issued the mask mandate. I felt secure that our board would follow that order and protect our children, whether they personally agreed with it or not. While the voices of those hundreds of parents in attendance were loud, our community is composed of *thousands* of voices.

I am utterly disappointed that the adults charged with the safety of our children would so easily bend to the wishes of a vocal minority.

I am shocked that our school district has issued an optional mandate based on the loophole of "extreme heat in the classrooms." The mean temperature for the first week of school is in the low 80s, with one day only reaching a high of 84. The Board went on to say "this includes buildings where air conditioning is available but possibly not fully functional in all locations" is thinly-veiled attempt to pander to that aforementioned vocal minority.

The board caved. It caved to political pressure. It caved to a vocal minority. It chose the easier, more popular path. It chose a popular political sentiment over it's overwhelmingly important top priority: TO KEEP THE CHILDREN OF TOMS RIVER SAFE.

The decision was misguided and cowardly.

How will 15 minutes in a 24 hour period, 3 - 6 feet, correctly and consistently wearing a mask be calculated and monitored?

Which other rules have stipulations as to when they do not need to be followed?

I suspect that none of these questions were answered because the Board has no answers. I also suspect that none of these questions were addressed because it would reveal the truth: that this Board has found a loophole to hide behind, rather than stand up for the safety of our community's children.

My wife took some photos of work being performed on Cedar Grove Elementary... I am quite shocked that there are large openings left in the side of approved occupancy rated buildings. Left in this unprotected condition, you create a severe risk of existing construction system exposed to both the weather and a possible intrusion of pests.

Your RFP documents for these projects specifically indicates in section 6.20 that the contractor shall supervise and direct the work using his best skill and attention.

He shall be solely responsible for all means, methods, techniques, sequences, and procedures for coordinating all portions of the work under this contract.

Leaving a fully operational building unprotected is clearly not using the best skill and attention. Protecting the existing building to ensure the sequence of construction is clearly their responsibility.

Section 6.29....The contractor shall be entirely responsible for proper care and protection of ALL work.

Section 6.30 During the progress of the Work, the contractor shall assume all risk and shall bear all loss occasioned through neglect or accident caused by his work or workmen, until such work has been completed and accepted.

Leaving an existing operational building open to the elements, specifically during a storm event, is not in anyway proper care or protection of all work, and specifically shall bear all risk and all loss.

Furthermore, your project specification manuals have several sections defining this issue.

013100-1 D. Administrative procedures – Coordinate scheduling and timing of required procedures.... Include but not limited to the following.... 3. Installation of temporary facilities and controls.

What is the administrative plan for the temporary facilities and controls to protect the existing building?

013100-6, B. Preconstruction Conference. Agenda shall discuss the following....

“r. responsibility for temporary facilities and controls..

s. procedures for moisture and mold control.”

What’s in the meeting minutes of the precon agenda on the temp facilities and controls, and mold and moisture mitigation procedures?

Leaving wide open areas of an existing building clearly does not comply with either of these topics.

013100-8..... Addresses it again in pre-install conference requirements.

If you reference section 015001-1, the specification on temporary facilities and controls, it addresses

Moisture protection plans, for protection of materials from water absorption and damage.

Part 3.4 Security and Protection Facilities Installation

1. Protection of existing facilities....

K. Temporary Enclosures... Provide temp enclosures for protection of construction, in progress and completed from exposure, foul weather..... Provide temporary weather tight enclosure for building exterior.

Part 3.5 – Moisture and Mold.

As you can see you have several sections of your construction specifications that require some sense of protecting building features from these elements....Mold and Moisture paramount as they directly affect the health and well being of all occupants.

I request that someone urgently review this situation, protect the existing buildings from the weather elements, and employ your special testing agency to check all humidity and moisture levels due to the current state of the unprotected features.

The health of our students and staff should be at the forefront of these projects.

On a personal level with a child attending this school, this raises a severe concern.... It is has rained for several hours today alone. And with the wind driven rain conditions, you are going to have water inside those classrooms.

From photos these openings have been open for several days.... Days that we had bad weather conditions.

Are you planning on having mold testing done to ensure the air quality in these classrooms is good? I know your new specification on the acoustical ceiling tiles calls for #1729 tile which has humiguard in it, but I'm not sure your old

ceiling tiles contain the same.

Based on the fact that these openings have existed for several days now, I'm assuming the contractor either doesn't have the manpower to protect them, doesn't feel its necessary or didn't include it in his budget and is pushing back....

At minimum you should employ your maintenance staff to grab a bucket truck, some form of plastic sheathing and get those openings wrapped up.....

Deal with the costs during arbitration later on...

I hope this email finds you well.

I am writing to you as your stakeholder, and as a concerned parent, regarding the conditions of a "safe" return to school set forth by Governor Murphy's Executive Order 251. I'm concerned because the Governor's order is void of any factual data. There is nothing "safe" about mask mandates. He has ignorantly neglected the recently conducted studies that conclude that masks do not provide significant protection against Covid-19, nor do they effectively prevent transmission. I would be glad to provide resources to support my argument upon request.

As a paraprofessional in a school district that remained fully operational (full day in-person learning, 5 days a week) throughout the 2020-2021 school year, I can speak with first hand knowledge of how efficiently germs spread and bacteria's grow with the prolonged wearing of a mask. I can speak to how inappropriately masks are utilized. I can speak to how often both children and teachers touch their germ infested masks and then proceed to touch commonly used surfaces. I can speak to how a child will drop their mask on the playground, or at their feet while sitting on a toilet, or in the sink, on the classroom floor, in the bottom of their backpacks, in their pockets, and then put the mask directly back on their faces. I urge you to adapt the resolution model that was proposed by the Middletown School district, wherein the Board of said district outlined its intent to maintain the EO, but give the parent and their family practitioner full authority to make a health decision for their child. It is a fair and appropriate compromise, until Governor Murphy rescinds his terrible decision and lifts the mask mandate.

I hope this email finds you well. Attached is a note from my daughters pediatrician to excuse her from wearing the mask in school. My daughter suffers from [REDACTED] and has been seen by Dr. Qazi who recommended [REDACTED] with Rose J. Testa, LSW regularly.

As per Governor Murphy's announcement on 8/6/2021, he states:

While masks will be broadly required in school buildings for the coming school year, exceptions will remain unchanged from the 2020-2021 school year, and include:

- When doing so would inhibit the individual's health such as when the individual is exposed to extreme heat indoors;
- When the individual has trouble breathing is unconscious, incapacitated, or otherwise unable to remove a face covering without assistance;
- When a student's documented medical condition or disability, as reflected in an Individualized Education Program (IEP) or Educational Plan pursuant to Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, precludes use of a face covering;
- When the individual is under two (2) years of age;
- When an individual is engaged in an activity that cannot be performed while wearing a mask, such as eating and drinking or playing an instrument that would be obstructed by the face covering;
- When the individual is engaged in high-intensity aerobic or anaerobic activity;
- When a student is participating in high-intensity physical activities during a physical education class in a well-ventilated location and able to maintain a physical distance of six feet from all other individuals; or
- When wearing a face covering creates an unsafe condition in which to operate equipment or execute a task.

With that being said,

This notice is to inform you that as of Sept 2021, my children, [REDACTED] will no longer be wearing a mask in their schools, High School South, Intermediate South and Washington Street Elementary. Throughout last school year, they have complained of multiple negative health effects directly related to wearing a mask. They have had difficulty breathing, and have begun experiencing anxiety while wearing a mask. They all have reported that when these issues arise in school, they pull their mask down momentarily to catch their breath and calm down. My daughter who attends HSS found it difficult to hear some teachers and understand them, especially when it came to foreign language. Now tell me how this all makes sense when they're going to school for six hours but they're going to take their masks off to eat and that's ok? This makes ZERO SENSE. [REDACTED] was written up last year for eating popcorn on the bus that HE BOUGHT AT SCHOOL. Nothing makes sense any more and I'm taking a stand, my children will not be used as political pawns for funding.

By way of this notice, I inform you that my children will no longer wear a mask in school. ANY attempts to discuss this issue with them, or to reprimand them for not wearing a mask will be considered bullying and discrimination, not to mention a complete disregard of my parental rights.

Should any issues arise because of their right to not wear a mask, I require you to bring those issues to my attention immediately. I can be reached by phone at [REDACTED].

Should my wishes be ignored or my children be discriminated against by ANY school employee I reserve my right to take action to the fullest extent of the law.

As the mom of 3 elementary children, one with Non-Verbal Autism, I can not believe we are here, begging for choice again. I know some of the Board shares the opinion of CHOICE on masking children. I participated in a Zoom call yesterday with Attorney Bruce Afran, Esq. and many other representatives from various districts, parents, students, teachers, etc. who are banding together in a lawsuit against Governor Murphy, the Commissioner of Health and the Commissioner of Education's ridiculous blanket, unconstitutional Mask Mandate for Children ONLY. As an individual Board Member and parent I am fully on board with this suit and am getting personally added. I cannot speak for the Board as a whole but I will be requesting our Board add our name to the suit as a show of more force against this ridiculous mandate.

To Whom It May Concern:

I am sending you this notice, on behalf of Katherine Shelly. My findings raise significant concerns, both medically and legally, of the current mask policy in place. Masks are ineffective for the purpose claimed by the mandate, potentially harmful, and only authorized for use by an EUA.

Masks are ineffective and in many ways they harm.

-
It's a myth that masks prevent viruses from spreading. The overall evidence is clear: Standard cloth and surgical masks offer next to no protection against virus-sized particles or small aerosols. There has been one large randomized controlled trial that specifically examined whether masks protect their wearers from the coronavirus. This study found mask wearing "did not reduce, at conventional levels of statistical significance, the incidence of Sars-Cov-2-infection."

The size of a virus particle is much too small to be stopped by a surgical mask, cloth or bandana. A single virion of SARS-CoV-2 is about 60-140 nanometers or 0.1 microns.² The pore size in a surgical mask is 200-1000x that size. Consider that the CDC website states, "surgical masks do not catch all harmful particles in smoke." And that the size of smoke particles in a wildfire are ~0.5 microns which is 5x the size of the SARS-CoV-2 virus! Wearing a mask to prevent catching SARS-CoV-2, or similarly sized influenza, is like throwing sand at a chain-link fence: it doesn't work. Consider also, that the existence of more particles does not mean more virus. Research shows less virus does not mean less illness. Dr. Kevin Fennelly, a pulmonologist at the National Heart, Lung and Blood institute debunked the view that larger droplets are responsible for viral transmission.

Fennelly wrote:

"current infection control policies are based on the premise that most respiratory infections are transmitted by large respiratory droplets- i.e., larger than 5 [microns] – produced by coughing and sneezing, ...Unfortunately, that premise is wrong."

Fennelly referenced a 1953 paper on anthrax that showed a single bacterial spore of about one micron was significantly more lethal than larger clumps of spores. Exposure to one virus particle is theoretically enough to cause infection and subsequent disease. This is not an alarming thought - it simply means what it has always meant, that our immune system protects us continually all our life.

There have been hundreds of mask studies related to influenza transmission done over several Part of that evidence shows Bacteria are 50x larger than virus particles. Related to the 1918-1919 influenza pandemic, there was almost universal agreement among experts, that deaths were virtually never caused by the influenza virus itself but resulted directly from severe secondary pneumonia caused by well-known bacterial "pneumopathogens" that colonized the upper respiratory tract. Dr. Fauci and his National Institute of Health studied pandemics and epidemics and concluded, "the vast majority of influenza deaths resulted from secondary bacterial pneumonia."

All parties mandating the use of facemasks are not only willfully ignoring established science but are engaging in what amounts to a whole school clinical experimental trial. This conclusion is reached by the fact that facemask use and COVID-19 incidence are being reported in scientific opinion pieces promoted by the CDC and others.

The fact is after reviewing ALL of the studies worldwide, the CDC found “no reduction in viral transmission with the use of face masks.”

Additionally, Children have been repeatedly shown not to be drivers of this contagion. It is well-accepted that children have a statistically zero chance of dying from COVID. The CDC shows the K-12 mortality rate from or with COVID is .00003. Any intervention, especially one that is prophylactic, must cause fewer harms to the recipient than the infection. Since children have the lowest death rate from COVID infection, the cost-benefit of requiring children to wear an investigational face-covering with emerging safety issues is especially difficult to justify.

Anthony Fauci was very clear that asymptomatic transmission was not a threat. He stated, “in all the history of respiratory-borne viruses of any type, asymptomatic transmission has never been the driver of outbreaks. The driver of outbreaks is always a symptomatic person.”

Wearing respirators come(s) with a host of physiological and psychological burdens. These can interfere with task performances and reduce work efficiency. These burdens can even be severe enough to cause life-threatening conditions if not ameliorated. Fifteen years ago, National Taiwan University Hospital concluded that the use of N-95 masks in healthcare workers caused them to experience hypoxemia, a low level of oxygen in the blood, and hypercapnia, an elevation in the blood's carbon dioxide levels. Studies of simple surgical masks found significant reductions in blood oxygen as well. In one particular study, researchers measured blood oxygenation before and after surgeries in 53 surgeons. Researchers found the mask reduced the blood oxygen levels significantly, and the longer the duration of wearing the mask, the greater the drop in blood oxygen levels.

Moreover, people with cancer, will be at a further risk from hypoxia, as cancer cells grow best in a bodily environment that is low in oxygen. Low oxygen also promotes systemic inflammation which, in turn, promotes “the growth, invasion and spread of cancers.” Repeated episodes of low oxygen, known as intermittent hypoxia, also “causes atherosclerosis” and hence increases “all cardiovascular events” such as heart attacks, as well as adverse cerebral events like stroke. Furthermore, the mandatory mouth mask in schools is a major threat to a child’s development. It ignores the essential needs of a growing child. The well-being of children and young people is highly dependent on the emotional connection with others. Masks create a threatening and unsafe environment, where emotional connection becomes difficult.

Informed consent is required for investigational medical therapies.

Regardless of the lack of safety and efficacy behind the decision to require a child to wear a mask, it is illegal to mandate EUA approved investigational medical therapies without informed consent. Mask use for viral transmission prevention is authorized for Emergency Use only. Emergency Use Authorization by the FDA, means “the products are investigational and experimental” only. The statute granting the FDA the power to authorize a medical product of emergency use requires that

the person being administered the unapproved product be advised of his or her right to refuse administration of the product. This statute further recognizes the well-settled doctrine that medical experiments, or “clinical research,” may not be performed on human subjects without the express, informed consent of the individual receiving treatment.

The right to avoid the imposition of human experimentation is fundamental, rooted in the Nuremberg Code of 1947, has been ratified by the 1964 Declaration of Helsinki, and further codified in the United States Code of Federal Regulations. In addition to the United States regarding itself as bound by these provisions, these principles were adopted by the FDA in its regulations requiring the informed consent of human subjects for medical research. There are no efficacy standards on child-sized masks and respirators under OSHA, but there are proven microbial challenges as well as breathing difficulties that are created and exacerbated by masking children.

This mandate is in direct conflict with Section 360bbb-3€(1)(A)(ii)(I-III), which requires the wearer to be informed of the option to refuse the wearing of such “device.” Misrepresenting the use of a mask as being intended for antimicrobial or antiviral protection, and/or misrepresenting masks for use as infection prevention or reduction is a deceptive practice under the FTC. It is clear, there is no waiver of liability under deceptive practices, even under a state of emergency.
